FUNCTION

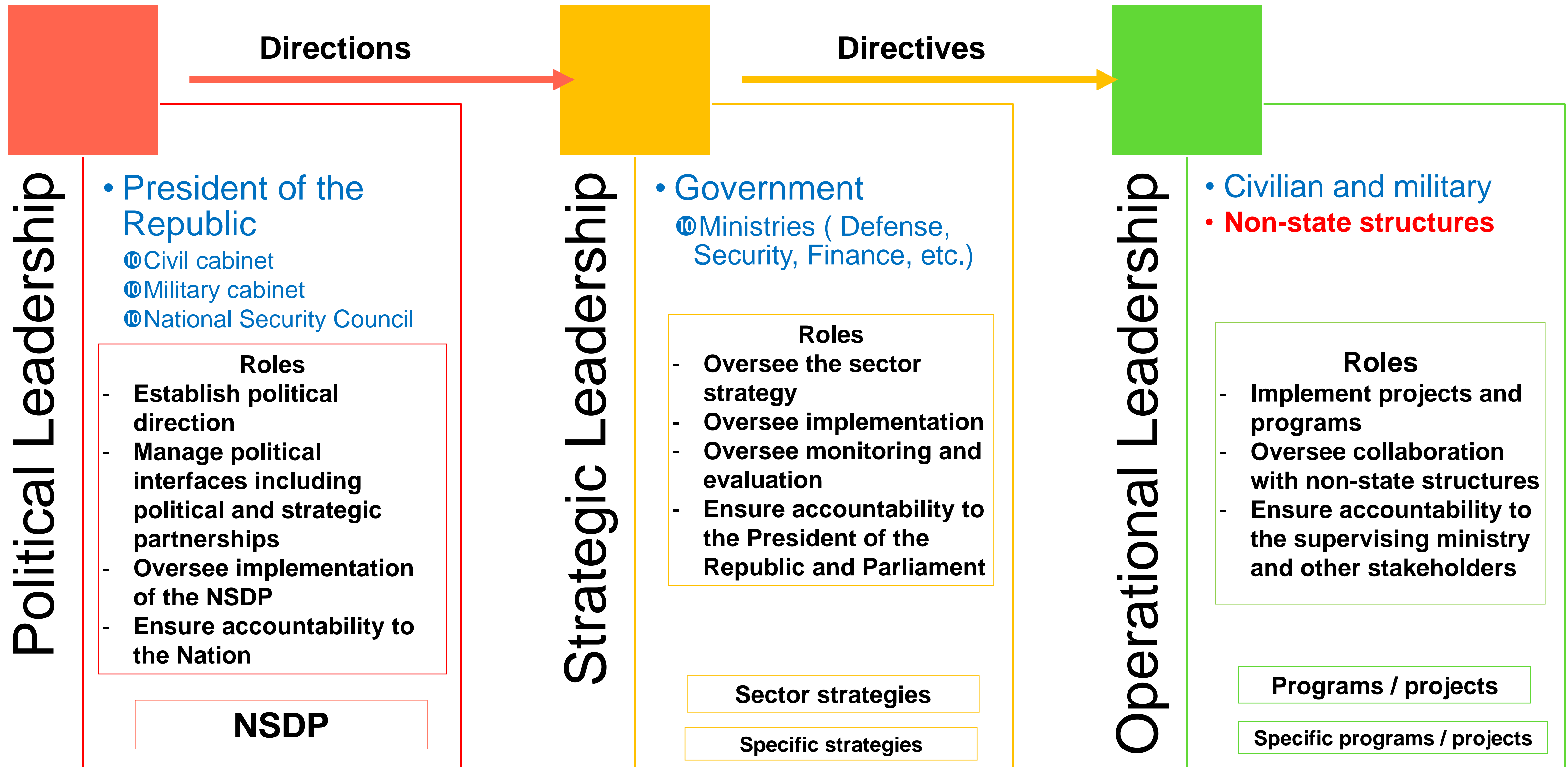

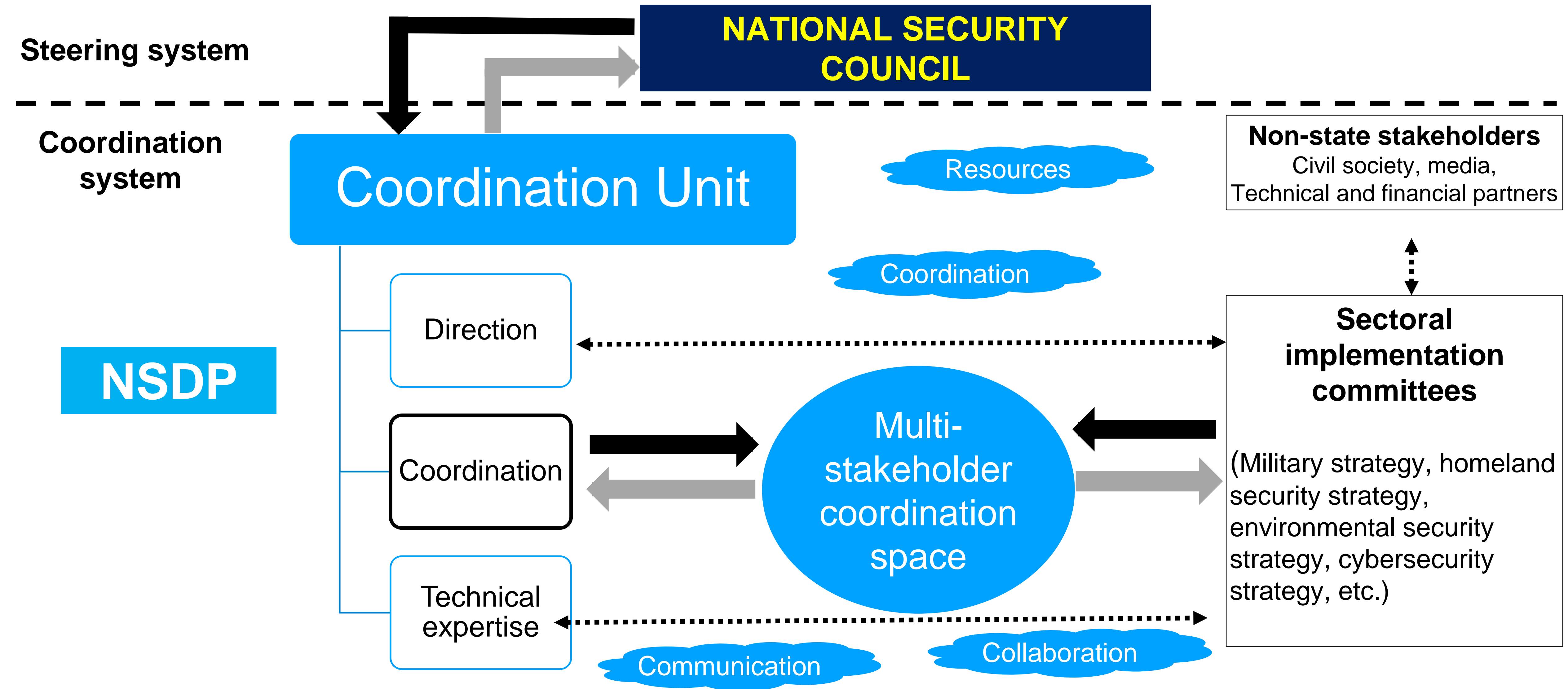
