Roundtable Summary

The Africa Center for Strategic Studies (ACSS), in collaboration with the United Nations (UN), and New York University's Center for International Cooperation (CIC), is pleased to convene senior leaders and experts to discuss how peace operations can address the growing threat posed by violent extremist (VE) groups. Participants will include current and former force commanders, mission heads, representatives from the UN, African Union, and Regional Economic Communities, USG officials, and experts, all of whom bring valuable experience in peace operations. The discussions will focus on strengthening Africa's regional security architecture in response to the VE threat and exploring how peace operations can effectively contribute to this effort.

This roundtable comes at a critical juncture, as the threat from VE groups has escalated significantly over the past decade, leading many African states to pursue alternative security solutions. Traditional peace operations have faced challenges in adapting to these new realities, underscoring the urgent need for reform to address complex threats. The discussions will compare peace operations with other multilateral approaches to countering VE threats, aiming to develop actionable and implementable solutions. The roundtable objectives are as follows:

- Convene senior peace operations leaders and experts to discuss experiences, lessons learned, and good practices in regional efforts to address violent extremism.
- 2. Identify opportunities for the United Nations, African Union, and other multilateral actors to improve their responses to violent extremist groups.
- 3. Catalyze the development of regional solution frameworks to address the violent extremist threat.
